INDIA AND JAPAN EXCHANGE NOTES; JAPAN COMMITS LOAN PACKAGE OF ABOUT RS.8632 CRORE TO FUND SEVEN PROJECTS; INDIA CONTINUES TO BE HIGHEST RECIPIENT OF ODA FROM JAPAN

The Notes worth Rs. 8632 crore were exchanged today between Japan and India. Shri Prabodh Saxena, Joint Secretary, Department of Economic Affairs, Government of India and H.E. Mr. Akitaka Saiki, Ambassador of Japan to India exchanged the notes at a simple ceremony, here today. Through this Exchange of Notes, Japan committed an amount of Yen 155.549 billion (about Rs.8632 crore for the second batch of FY 2010 JICA ODA loan package) to fund the following 7 (seven) projects:-
